We're determined to keep all of our pupils on-track this year and make sure no one falls behind if they need to learn from home because of coronavirus.

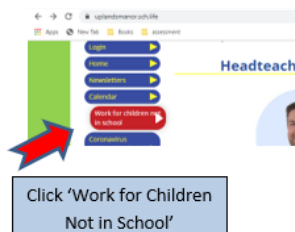

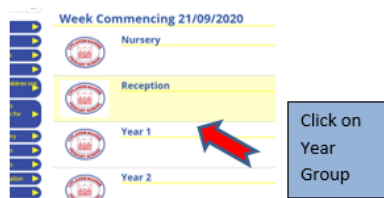

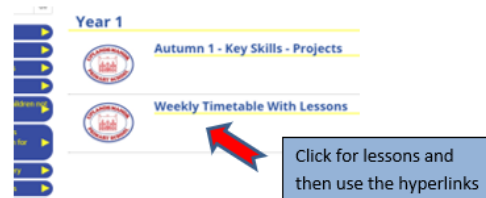

It's important that your child engages with home learning. If they aren't, we can use the following strategies to provide additional support:

- Phone calls home
- Increased feedback

What support will the school provide?

- **Regular contact with teachers** through phone calls and the year group email addresses
- **Regular feedback** on a weekly basis from teachers when you email work to them so that your child knows how they're doing
- **ICT support:** If you have any questions or problems with log ins, technological problems etc. please contact our helpful ICT team who will be happy to assist:

- **If you are not able to access online learning,** please call school on 0121 558 1602 and request a paper pack of activities which we will then send through the post or, in some instances, we may be able to loan you a laptop

What else can I do to help my child?

Create a positive environment for your child to learn at home, for example:

- **Distinguish between weekdays and weekends,** to separate school life and home life
- **Designate a working space if possible,** and at the end of the day have a clear cut-off to signal school time is over
- **Create and stick to a routine,** as this is what your child is used to at school. For example, eat breakfast at the same time each morning and make sure they're dressed before starting the 'school' day
- **Stick a timetable up on the wall** so everyone knows what they should be doing when, and tick activities off throughout the day
- **Make time for exercise and breaks** throughout the day to keep your child active
